Information: According to the law (sect. 26 para. 4 DSG 2000), you have the right to receive within eight weeks either the requested information, or a reason given in writing why the information is not or not completely provided. The information can be refused for reasons of overriding public interests, such as the prevention and prosecution of crimes. For example, a person wanted for arrest in a Schengen country should not be able to estimate in advance the risk of being arrested when crossing the border. The wording of a given information is therefore always intentionally neutral (sect. 26 para. 5 DSG 2000). If you want to have the information examined because you think it is wrong or not complete, you can bring a complaint before the Austrian data protection authority [Datenschutzbehörde] pursuant to sect. 31 para. 1 DSG 2000.
